

# TIMELY WARNING – SAFETY ALERT

## Mission College

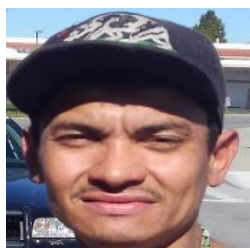
**Incident Type:** Disturbance/Suspicious Circumstances

**Date Occurred:** 09/09/2020

**Reference:** District Police Case # 2009-00085



**DETAILS:** On September 9, 2020 at approximately 1:03 PM officers responded to a report of a suspicious person creating a disturbance and chasing two juveniles near the Mission College baseball field and Calabazas Creek area. Although the subject was gone when the officers arrived on scene, the reporting party showed officers a photo she had taken of the subject. Officers recognized the subject from prior contacts as Hector Villalobos. Villalobos is known to live in the area of Mission College. The area was searched and officers located Villalobos in Calabazas Creek adjacent to Mission College. Villalobos has been known to be associated with weapons in the past including a crossbow, metal pipes, and possibly firearms. Villalobos was recently arrested at Mission College on 09/07/2020 for brandishing a weapon (WVMPD case # 2009-00084). Villalobos has demonstrated a pattern of threatening and unusual behavior. ### Safety Tips

1. PROGRAM CAMPUS POLICE DISPATCH NUMBERS INTO YOUR PHONE – Within the campus community our police department can respond to emergencies faster than local law enforcement. The seven digit 9-1-1 number is: 408-299-3233
2. REPORT SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY – Criminals do not want to be seen or heard. We rely on the community to report suspicious activity. We would much rather respond and not be needed than to not be called when something could have been prevented or stopped. Trust your instincts; if something does not feel right, it probably isn't.
3. BE AWARE OF YOUR SURROUNDINGS – Avoid going to secluded areas of the campus alone. If you are going into a dark or concealed area of the campus, find a trusted classmate or colleague to go to these areas with you.
